

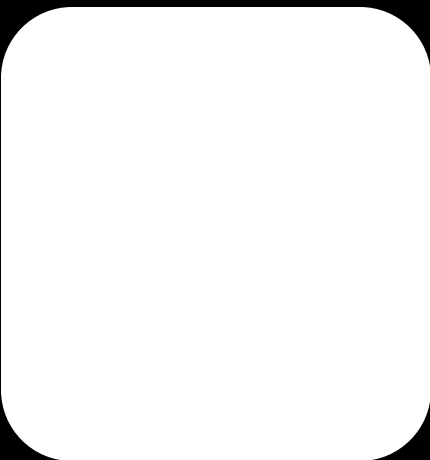

Working at camp allows you to develop strong leadership skills and apply your outdoor skills and experience with children. All of these are valuable assets for your professional future.

### Who Can Apply

- Young adults between ages 18-30 interested in a rich cultural experience at summer camp in the US
- University students and young professionals who speak English
- People who have experience working with children and a love for the outdoors



### ICCP Jobs

**Camp counselors** are students or young professionals who provide direct supervision, program instruction, and in many cases, must live with the campers. The J-1 visa designation is Camp Counselor.

**Support staff** participants work in kitchens, maintenance for buildings and grounds, in the camp office, etc. The work is very demanding and participants must have strong motivation for hard work. Responsibilities do not include direct supervision of the campers. The J-1 visa designation is Work/Travel.
